

Cropping Errors

If you use the Crop tool specifying a Height and Width for the crop the Crop tool will not always perform the crop correctly. Until Adobe fixes this problem you need to check the cropped image by going to the Image>Image Size pull down menu to check the cropped size. If the crop did not work correctly you can try rotating the image and performing the crop or you might have to change the crop dimensions slightly.

If you want to witness this malfunction perform the following simple test.

Create a new file 1 x 1.5 inches (width = 1, height = 1.5) at 2000 DPI.

Then set the crop tool to 2 x 3 inches without resampling (no resolution entered in the Resolution field) crop the entire image (as if you were using the Crop tool to resize the image) and it will crop correctly.

After each crop drop the Crop History state in the Garbage Can to return to the 1 x 1.5 inch image.

Then set the crop tool to .96 x 1.44 inches without resampling (no resolution entered in the Resolution field) crop the entire image and it will crop correctly.

Then set the crop tool to 4 x 6 inches without resampling (no resolution entered in the Resolution field) crop the entire image and it will crop correctly.

Then set the crop tool to .5 x .75 without resampling (no resolution entered in the Resolution field) try to crop the entire image and it will crop the image to .5 x .7 incorrectly.

Then rotate the image 90 degrees and set the crop tool to .5 x .75 without resampling (no resolution entered in the Resolution field) crop the entire image and it will crop correctly.
